





Background

- In Colorado, a gun suicide death occurs every 13 hours. In 2022, gunfire took
 the lives of 1,033 Coloradans and 73% of all gun deaths were suicides.
- Suicide is the leading cause of death for Colorado youth and young adults (10-24). Black children and teens are 5 times more likely than their white peers to die by guns.
- Colorado veterans have a significantly higher rate of suicide than the national average. Colorado expects a 39% increase in veteran service needs and current resources are inadequate to meet the needs of 388,000 Colorado Veterans.
- Women experiencing domestic violence are 5 times more likely to be killed when a gun in present in the home. In Colorado, 86% of domestic violence homicides are committed with a gun.
- Funding for victim services has been <u>cut in half</u> since 2018 and <u>there are more</u> funding cuts expected. Without critical funding for victim services, programs across Colorado will lay off staff, eliminate programming, and close their doors leaving over 150,000 victims without services.
